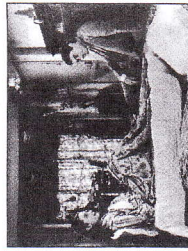


- You are going to read a dialogue from a film. Some verbs are missing from the text.

Robert Capa



On 3 December 1938 *Picture Post* (0) _____ "The Greatest War Photographer in the World: Robert Capa" with a spread of 26 photographs (1) _____ during the Spanish Civil War.
 But the "greatest war photographer" (2) _____ war. Born Endre Friedmann to Jewish parents in Budapest in 1913, he studied political science in Berlin. Driven out of the country by the (3) _____ of a Nazi regime, he settled in Paris in 1933. He met the journalist and photographer Gerda Taro with whom they invented the 'famous' American (4) _____ Robert Capa and began to sell his prints under that name. He met Pablo Picasso and Ernest Hemingway, and formed friendships with fellow photographers.

From 1936 onwards, Capa's coverage of the Spanish Civil War appeared (5) _____. His picture of a Loyalist soldier who had just been fatally (6) _____ earned him his international reputation and became a powerful symbol of (7) _____.
 After his companion, Gerda Taro, was killed in Spain, Capa travelled to China in 1938 and emigrated to New York a (8) _____ later. As a correspondent in Europe, he photographed the Second World War, covering the landing of American troops on Omaha (9) _____ on D-Day, the liberation of Paris and the Battle of the Bulge.

In 1947 Capa founded Magnum Photos. On 25 May 1954 he was photographing for *Life* in Thailand, Binh, Indochina, when he stepped on a landmine and was killed.
